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ITINERARY

Day 1: ARRIVAL

Upon arrival at Keflavik International Airport pick up your pre-booked rental car. If you are arriving early, you will have the option to make a detour to the famous Blue Lagoon for a relaxing bath or to explore Reykjavik, the most northerly located capital in the world.

1 night accommodation at Hotel in Reykjavik.

Day 2: REYKJAVIK AND BORGARFJÖRÐUR VALLEY

Explore the most northerly located capital in the world. Drive along the scenic route of Fjord Hvalfjörður or take the tunnel that connects Reykjavik to the western and northern parts of Iceland.

We recommend a visit to the Settlement Centre in Borgarnes. Deildartunguhver hot spring is the most active hot spring in Iceland and a visit to its geothermal bath resort Krauma is recommended. The picturesque waterfalls Hraunfossar and Barnafoss are not far away. Guided tours of the lava cave Víðgelmir as well as or the man-made ice cave in Langjökull glacier, are available all year round. If you want to see (and drive) more, move Reykjavik and Borgarfjörður to another day, and drive along the beautiful Snæfellsnes peninsula and visit Hraunfossar and Deildartunguhver the following day, or simply add one day to your itinerary.

On your journey along the Snæfellsnes peninsula, you will pass the peculiar shaped mountain Kirkjufell, Iceland's most photographed mountain. At the tip of the peninsula, you'll reach the National Park with the glacier covered volcano Snæfellsjökull. Enjoy a walk at the black pebble beach Djúpalónssandur, relish the stunning rock formations of Hellnar cove and the cliffs at Arnarstapi fishing hamlet and perhaps join a guided tour into the lava cave Vatnshellir.

1 night accommodation in Borgarnes area.
Ca. 180 km Borgarfjörður, ca. 370 km along Snæfellsnes peninsula



Day 3: GOLDEN CIRCLE

Explore the UNESCO World Heritage Site and Þingvellir National Park. Walk through the Almannagjá tectonic rift, pass the site of the first parliament, Althing and enjoy Öxaráfoss waterfall. Your journey will take you to Geysir hot spring area where Strokkur erupts every five minutes or so. Another stop is the majestic waterfall Gullfoss, one of Iceland's famous natural wonders. We recommend a visit to Friðheimar greenhouse where you can treat yourself to a delicious tomato ice cream or try mushrooms at Iceland's only mushroom farm, Flúðasveppir, before heading to the Secret Lagoon pool for a relaxing bath.

2 night accommodation in Hvolsvöllur/Skógar area. Ca. 280 km

Day 4: SOUTH COAST

Take an unforgettable walk behind Seljalandsfoss waterfall and the stairs to the brim of the waterfall Skógafoss. The local folk and transport museum Skógasafn exhibits an original turf-farm as well as historical items from days long gone. Optional excursions include a glacier hike or snowmobile tour on the Sólheimajökull glacier, Super Jeep tours into the black sands including a visit to an ice cave or an ATV tour to the black sand beach and famous plane wreck. The bird cliffs of Dyrhólaey with the eroded rock arch are worth a detour. Explore Reynisfjara black beach with its fascinating basalt columns but beware of the waves.

Day 5: CHARMING FORMER FISHING VILLAGES AND REYKJANES PENINSULA

The villages along the shore in South Iceland have been important harbours and trading centers in former centuries. A large number of preserved houses from the period 1890-1920 are situated in Eyrarbakki. The area offers stunning views over the Atlantic Ocean and opportunities for outdoor activities such as hiking, bird watching and kayaking.

Drive along the southern part of the Reykjanes Peninsula. You will drive through the raw lava landscape, see the bubbling mud pots and fumaroles at Krysuvik and Lake Kleifarvatn. Another visit that is well worth it is the wooden church Strandakirkja in Selvogur standing at the seaside.

Add on a visit to the famous Blue lagoon or head on further out to the tip of the peninsula and visit the Gunnuher hot spring and the Bridge over continents, a footbridge that spans over a fissure that was created by the mid-Atlantic ridge.

1 night accommodation in Grindavik or airport area.
Ca. 180 – 200 km

Day 6: DEPARTURE

Drive to the airport and give back your rental car.
We recommend the last night stay close to the airport, if your flight is early in the morning.
